15. SECOND ROSTER OF PUBLIC COMMENTS (Limit comments to 3 minutes or less)

Dr. Chenavis Evans of Critical Insights Consulting, LLC, Auburn, Alabama spoke first. Dr. Evans stated she wanted to clarify some things that had been shared publicly about Critical Insights Consulting, and then apologized to any non-profit organizations about anything stated that was misinterpreted as them being paid by Critical Insights Consulting or by the City of Opelika. Dr. Evans stated Critical Insights Consulting had been working through contracts approved by the council for the past four years and their number one objective was to coordinate with the police department and community to find better ways of meeting the needs of the community. Dr. Evans then explained all the different programs and projects that were delivered by Critical Insights Consulting to the City of Opelika, the Opelika Police Department, and the citizens of Opelika over the last four years. Dr. Evans closed by stating they had achieved all of their stated deliverables, and then asked if anyone wanted more transparency, information, facts or data to come to Critical Insights Consulting directly, and that they would be happy to provide that to them.

Mattie Clark of 706 Orchard Avenue spoke next. Ms. Clark asked the council if they could tell her who she needed to talk to about the removal of the bricks on Auburn Street or the house on West Street, that needed to be demolished, that she brought them pictures of at the last meeting. President Smith stated that the City Administrator would speak with her about it.

Sherry Cook of 409 Wittle Avenue spoke next. Ms. Cook stated she wanted to address the most appalling, degrading, and vindictive behavior she had ever witnessed from an elected official in their community. Ms. Cook stated she was recently made aware of a public post, made by the current city council representative of Ward 2, about the Ambassadors of Change community liaisons

being allegedly given over \$1.8 million by the City of Opelika, its sole existence was to divide the community, inform the police of crimes, and had endangered the council representative's family. Ms. Cook stated all the accusations made were untrue. Ms. Cook then stated that the same city council representative made another public post with Ms. Cook's name specifically circled, and she normally doesn't react to social media mockery, but when this was done by her current elected official in Ward 2, she was compelled to respond. Ms. Cook closed by challenging the city and the council to act immediately to impose some type of sanction to hold this council representative accountable for the harmful claims she made against the very people who are currently doing her job.

JoAnn Brown of 401 Wittle Court spoke next. Ms. Brown stated that she had been volunteering with the Ambassadors of Change liaisons group, and she has seen a lot of good things happening in the community around Wittle Court and Avenue, including needed stop signs, more police safety checks on the area, and cleanup days performed by the group. Ms. Brown also stated the community there had installed more "Ring" doorbells as a security measure for themselves and the rest of the neighborhood. Ms. Brown stated that they all seem to have a better relationship with the Opelika Police Department and that she appreciates all the community liaison volunteers for their concern and care for the community. Ms. Brown closed by stating just how beneficial volunteering in the group has been for her and, again, how much she appreciates the group and their work in the community.

Janataka Holmes of 1012 Covenant Drive spoke next. Ms. Holmes thanked the city, the council, the liaisons, and everyone that came out to the Juneteenth event, which was very successful again this year.

Erica Norris of 703 Edmon Avenue spoke next. Ms. Norris stated that, as a citizen, she had questions about the \$1,864,093.64 paid to Critical Insights Consulting. Ms. Norris stated that the initial amount was \$1.3 million plus and at that time she, in her role as a member of the council, questioned the validity of that amount. Ms. Norris stated there was no bidding and no competition for the initial \$1.3 million paid, so she questioned that at that time and again when an additional \$500,000 was brought back to the council for approval later. Ms. Norris then stated there was also no request to have an accounting of how those funds that were given to Critical Insights Consulting were to be used because, she was told, that was not required. Ms. Norris stated that she was also told by the City Administrator that Critical Insights Consulting would not be coming back for funds, and they came back for more. Ms. Norris also stated that she appreciates the work they are actually doing in the community, but she does not believe it is \$1.8 million worth of work. Ms. Norris closed by stating that her family was in grave danger due to Ms. Cook going to a community meeting, sitting in the back where there were no cameras, and brought two citizens that were talking about a shooting in their shared neighborhood.
